Through our many communications to owners, we have detailed the procedures for the operation of the bar and restaurant to confirm we will only be operating on Wednesday and Thursday, 5–9pm; Friday and Saturday 12noon–2pm and 5–10pm; and Sunday 12noon–5pm.

You must book a table to drink or eat. We have removed the amusements and created five drinking tables in the space that was vacated and we are operating a much reduced capacity in the restaurant area, with two sittings as detailed.

Bookings can be made by emailing foh@woodland-park.co.uk, no telephone bookings will be accepted and we will only be accepting card payments, no cash. The team will also be operating a take away which can be ordered using the application on our website.

The drastic reduction in space in order to achieve high levels of social distancing, the new cleaning protocols and the amount of staff and customers we can actually have in the space itself, of course, has an impact on income and the overall viability of the clubhouse.

Given the new regimes and reduced income levels, we have taken the decision that the last day of bar and restaurant service this calendar year will be Sunday 20th December. There will be no bar and restaurant facilities until we re-open the entire park on Friday 12th February, 2021.

Therefore, from September 30th, 2020 we will no longer be accepting mail or parcels on behalf of owners and alternative arrangements will need to be made.

Within four weeks of the shutdown our Directors developed a completely new business plan and strategy, not only to deal with the immediate problem but also to protect the business in the event of further lockdowns and any future pandemics.

The decision was taken to withdraw from the hire fleet side of the business to sell our own holiday homes, lodges and cabins and to concentrate our resources on providing a high-quality owners exclusive experience. At the time of writing we have sold all of our caravans, five of our cabins and two of our lodges. We expect to be an owners exclusive park by around mid-summer 2021.

On the farm

Our Directors' farming activities continue at a pace this month with harvest underway. The family is currently utilising their John Deere combine harvester, which has a 15-metre cutting width and costs around £480,000. With this piece of equipment, over the next 20–25 days they can achieve an average of 100 acres harvesting per day. This beast of a machine consumes on average 500 litres of fuel per day, and that's before the beer consumed by the operator! The harvesting team work 12 hour days and 13 days in a row, followed by one day off and then they do it all over again. The Barley goes to a maltings in Ryburgh and is used to make beer and whisky.

leisure facilities

The team are very pleased to announce that Trimingham Leisure Club will be reopening as of the 25th July, 2020.

There are some important changes to our operating procedures due to recent government guidelines. Some key points are detailed below:

- You must book before you arrive at the leisure facilities – please call 01263 576039. These will be one-hour slots, staggered between the gym and the swimming pool to assist with social distancing. We will require your membership number (on the back of your card) to book your slot.
